J. D. Elder: *Tell me, sir, tell me your full name properly. Talk in the mike.*

Matthew Thomas: *Matthew Thomas*.

J. D. Elder: *Matthew Thomas, how long you been singing this kalinda, sir?*

Matthew Thomas: Well, since I was a boy about fifteen years of age.

J. D. Elder: When did you learn kalinda, who taught it to you?

Matthew Thomas: By my own head piece – by hearing the old men singing, and I have the voice for singing.

J. D. Elder: Could you tell me some of the old stick men who used to be about here in Mayaro?

Matthew Thomas: In Mayaro, here?

J. D. Elder: Yes.

Matthew Thomas: *Now, presently?*

J. D. Elder: *No, the old one in your time, long, long ago.*

Matthew Thomas: No.

J. D. Elder: *You remember some of them?* **Matthew Thomas:** *No, not here, now presently.*

J. D. Elder: Where you know good stick men in Trinidad?

Matthew Thomas: Tortuga!

J. D. Elder: *Tortuga*. Matthew Thomas: *Yes*.

J. D. Elder: You could remember name? **Matthew Thomas:** Yes, Carew is one.

J. D. Elder: Carew, yes.

Matthew Thomas: Yes. Fetty Thomas is one.

J. D. Elder: Ah-ah.

Matthew Thomas: And Darsamba is one.

J. D. Elder: Yes.

Matthew Thomas: *And others that I couldn't remember them today.*

J. D. Elder: You can't remember them.

Matthew Thomas: No.

J. D. Elder: *Tell me, what is the length of the stick?*

Matthew Thomas: *The length of the stick?*

J. D. Elder: Yes, the poui.

Matthew Thomas: Three feet.

J. D. Elder: Three feet.

Unidentified: *No*, *no*, *no*, *man!* [Sticks are usually closer to four feet.]

Matthew Thomas: Three feet.
J. D. Elder: Three feet long.
Matthew Thomas: Yes.

J. D. Elder: What wood you use to make the stick?

Matthew Thomas: Gasparee and poui.

J. D. Elder: *On what days you used to play kalinda? What days and so on?*

Matthew Thomas: Carnival.

J. D. Elder: Yes

Matthew Thomas: Masquerade day.

J. D. Elder: You never used to play Carnival any other days?

Matthew Thomas: *No.*

J. D. Elder: What about August Day? [Emancipation Day]

Matthew Thomas: *No, well we never accustomed to that white rum.*

J. D. Elder: *Oh, I see. What about Easter Monday?*

Matthew Thomas: *Easter Monday.* **J. D. Elder:** *You used to play?*

Matthew Thomas: Yes.

J. D. Elder: And what's the name? Say the words of that song you just sing for me.

Matthew Thomas: "Say way wangala, / ba-mwen sewe, / Malwe whoy." He say, "Hide the

stick." Hide the obeah they bring for them.

J. D. Elder: Again.

Matthew Thomas: Hide the obeah you bring for me.

J. D. Elder: Who bring the obeah for you?

Matthew Thomas: Well, eh, other stick mens.

J. D. Elder: Other stick men?

Matthew Thomas: Yes.

J. D. Elder: I see.
